(World) Missions

We strongly promote world missions and theological education within an international context. Our Professors and Instructors are from all over the world and we work with institutions in the USA, Great Britain, Australia and South Africa. We encourage cross-cultural practical experience and learning from Christians of different cultures and denominations.

Paul's book to the Romans is one of the most systematic presentations of the gospel according to the teaching of Old Testament texts. But even more striking, Paul's first goal in writing Romans was to win over the church for world missions (Romans 1:1–15; 15:1–17). True biblical teaching always leads to evangelism, the edification of the church and world missions, and true missions will always look to Scripture for its *raison d'être*.

World Missions takes a high priority at Martin Bucer, for example, through its involvement in the German edition of „Operation World“ and its cooperation with other international missions organizations and academic institutions.

Educational Model

Jesus educated his disciples through discipleship, meaning:

1. He taught them knowledge
2. He counseled them individually
3. He taught and counseled them in groups
4. He mentored them until they were able to individually apply what they had experienced practically as a group

We intently wrestle with the presuppositions and results of „Higher Criticism“ but refuse to let our study of Scripture be consumed with refuting it. Proverbs warns us: „Stop listening to the instruction that will make you stray from the words of knowledge“ (Proverbs 19:27).

Paul writes to Timothy: „And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others“ (2 Tim. 2,2)
